



National Electronic Injury Surveillance System (NEISS)

How Data Can Help Your Hospital

NEISS tracks emergency department (ED) visits related to recent injuries. NEISS gathers data for a variety of injuries including those associated with consumer products, adverse drug events, child poisonings, chemical burns, assaults, falls, and more. NEISS data are used by hospital quality, safety, injury, emergency, and research departments. Participating hospitals receive customized data reports prepared by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). Such reports have presented data on fireworks, cribs, adverse drug events, falls, and bathtub water. Hospitals use NEISS data for clinical planning, staff training, research, and community outreach and education. Participating hospitals submit data requests at NEISSweb@CPSC.gov.
