Choose the Right Synonym for *recall*

Verb

REMEMBER, RECOLLECT, RECALL, REMIND, REMINISCE mean to bring an image or idea from the past into the mind. REMEMBER implies a keeping in memory that may be effortless or unwilling. // remembers that day as though it were yesterday // RECOLLECT implies a bringing back to mind what is lost or scattered. // as near as I can recollect // RECALL suggests an effort to bring back to mind and often to re-create in speech. // can't recall the words of the song // REMIND suggests a jogging of one's memory by an association or similarity. // that reminds me of a story // REMINISCE implies a casual often nostalgic recalling of experiences long past and gone. // old college friends like to reminisce //
