- New Source Performance Standard (EPA)
  - o Efforts to create a cordwood test method
  - o EPA (IDC) method vs. ASTM E3053-17 EPA is creating a rule despite the existence of an ASTM standard. An experienced testing lab says that all the products they tested meet both standards
- Gas Efficiency
  - o Department of Energy
  - o California energy commission
  - The pilot light on gas fireplaces is the largest energy draw, since pilot lights on new gas fireplaces are not always-on there is belief that the timing for regulations may be extended
  - Work on delayed ignition
  - Work by CSA on permanently installed combustible ceilings above barbeques outdoor kitchens are making these types of installations popular so there is work on determining acceptability
- NFPA
  - o NFPA 211
  - o NFPA 54
- ASHRAE
  - o ASHRAE 62.2 code is attempting to include requirements that would effectively prohibit unvented fireplaces indoors. This work may not be based on data
- ASTM
  - o ASTM cordwood work was already discussed
  - o CPSC provided an update on the status of portable fireplaces and FMDs on fuel containers. HR919 was mentioned
  - o Work on pellet barbeques is currently under an UL standard, there has been discussion about moving it to ASTM, however at this time it will stay under UL
