SUMMARY OF MEETING:

Task group members continued discussion of loaded and multiple drawers. CPSC staff updated the group that they have resumed testing with filled and/or multiple drawers open as well as carpeting, but do not have any results to share with the group yet. No new testing has been done by other task group members, but some plan to do future testing based on a test plan that members have previously prepared. Task group members would like CPSC staff to share their test methods with the task group to help align testing.

Members discussed how to test units with drawer interlock systems, including how to evaluate whether an interlock system can be disengaged. Some members expressed concern that consumers could override any interlock system, for example by removing hardware. Discussion also included systems that consumers could disengage, but would automatically re-engage when a drawer is closed.

The task group chair plans to send draft language to task group members for comments and edits before the November 12 sub-committee meeting. The next task group meeting will be scheduled after sub-committee meeting.
