## **DELEGATIONS OF AUTHORITY - REGULATORY**

# DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS AND TAKE REGULATORY ACTIONS ON THE FEDERAL POLICY FOR THE PROTECTION OF HUMAN SUBJECTS

- 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this order is to delegate authority to the Executive Director, and the General Counsel, to make recommendations and to take regulatory actions as necessary to evaluate any proposed or final changes provided to CPSC staff by the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to the Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects, codified at 16 C.F.R part 1028, and to publish in the Federal Register notice of such proposed or final changes as necessary.
- REFERENCE. Section 27(b)(10) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2076(b)(10)) empowers the Commission to delegate any of its functions or powers, other than the power to issue certain subpoenas under Section 27(b)(3), to any officer or employee of the Commission.
- 3. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY. Pursuant to Section 27(b)(10) of the Consumer Product Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2076(b)(10)), the Commission hereby delegates to the Executive Director, authority to make recommendations and to take regulatory actions as necessary to evaluate any proposed or final changes provided to CPSC staff by HHS to the Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects, with concurrence by the General Counsel. The Commission also hereby delegates to the General Counsel authority to draft and publish notices and rules in the *Federal Register* regarding the Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects in accordance with the recommendations made by the Executive Director.
- 4. COMMISSION NOTIFICATION. If the Executive Director intends to exercise the authority granted herein, the Executive Director shall notify the Commission of such

intention at least three days before doing so. Upon such notification, the Commission may revoke the delegated authority set forth within this Order, but shall do so within three days of notification by the Executive Director. If the Commission does not revoke authority within that timeframe, the Executive Director may exercise the authority described herein.

5. **REDELEGATION OF AUTHORITY.** This authority may be redelegated.
