This investigation was initiated during an indoor air sampling study conducted by CPSC and Environmental Health and Engineering (EH&E). The consumer, a 37 year old female, submitted a Consumer Incident Report via the internet regarding imported drywall from China. Information for this report was gathered during an on-site interview with the consumer. During this interview employees from EH&E conducted in-door air sampling tests to include in the on-going study.

The house was built in November 2006. The consumer and her family, 42 year old husband and nine year old son, moved in at the end of November 2006. The 1,950 square foot, single story house was built using wood studs and contains four bedroom and two bathrooms. All four bedrooms and hallway are carpeted. The kitchen, living room, dining room, and bathrooms are tiled. All of the appliances are electric.



There have been no changes or renovations in the house since it was built. There has not been any drywall replaced or added in the house.

Approximately six months after moving into the house, the family began to experience unexplainable health issues that they had not experienced prior to moving. The consumer experiences nasal congestions, shortness of breath, headaches, and a swollen/sore throat. The consumer's husband experiences nasal congestion and a scratchy/irritated throat. The consumer's son experiences nose bleeds. All three family members experience a chronic cough, and red/dry eyes. All three family members have been treated at urgent care clinics and prescribed medications to treat upper respiratory infections. The medications alleviate the symptoms temporarily. The symptoms lessen within 10 to 12 hours of leaving the house, but worsen within an hour of returning to the house. The family owns one bird. The consumer has not seen any changes in the bird's habits, but has consulted with a friend that is knowledgeable about birds. The consumer was informed that the bird will not show signs until it is too late to save its life.

The consumer first noticed a problem when the new microwave and the kitchen ceiling fan stopped working within two months of living in the house. She also noticed that light bulbs would last approximately two weeks before having to be replaced. The consumer's mother noticed the "rotten egg" smell first. The consumer barely noticed the odor when moving in, but now her awareness of the odor has heightened. The consumer notices the odor when entering the house after being gone for a few hours. The odor is strongest in the attic, the front door area, and during the summer months.


The consumer has experienced issues with electrical appliances in the house. Two desk top computers have had the hard drives crash a total of five times. The consumer noticed a pattern of approximately six to nine months between each crash. A 50 inch plasma flat screen television purchased in August 2007 stopped working in September 2008. The consumer reported that the television began showing a line across the screen and more lines began to appear until it stopped working. She was informed that it was an electrical problem and that there was corrosion present in the circuit board. The digital panel on the refrigerator is currently not working properly. The consumer sets the panel at specific temperatures and then notices that the temperatures change randomly.


The consumer has had the air conditioning evaporator coils replaced three times and the outdoor unit replaced twice. In May 2007 the first coil was replaced due to a leak. Each time thereafter, a leak caused the replacement. In the summer of 2008, the consumer received the current evaporator coils that have a black protective coating. The photograph below shows the current evaporator coils.




The consumer has had a fire occur in the guest bathroom in an electrical receptacle. The fire did not spread and was contained in the bathroom. An electrician replaced the receptacle and she has not had any other issues since. She now believes a fire hazard is present in her home. On a consistent basis the consumer has experienced flickering lights, circuit breakers tripping for no apparent reason, arcs/sparks, sizzling/buzzing, and light bulbs that are abnormally hot. The consumer has not experienced light switches or outlets that are warm or hot to the touch or an unusual odor in the vicinity of receptacles, switches, or light fixtures. The smoke alarms in the house are hardwired and beep unexpectedly for no apparent reason


The consumer has noticed signs of blackening, corrosion, and pitting on visible metal throughout the house, such as shower heads, faucets, and copper pipes. The consumer also reported that the water has a blue tint and leaves a blue stain on the shower and tub. The photographs below show the corrosion on the metal surfaces and the blue stain in the shower.






Photographs show pitting on a metal shower head and faucet.






Photographs show blackening of copper pipes near the air conditioning unit and water heater.



Photograph shows a blue stain from water.




Photograph shows blackened ground wire.

The consumer has retained an attorney and is seeking litigation to resolve the issue. The attorney has been in contact with the builder. The builder has provided the name and contact information for the drywall company that supplied the imported drywall (Exhibit 2). The consumer has attempted to make an insurance claim and the insurance company sent an inspector to complete a full inspection of the house in June 2009. In July 2009 the claim was denied because the consumer did not sustain a "direct physical loss." (Exhibit 3)


The consumer has been in contact with government officials in her state. She has received acknowledgment that her complaint has been received. She was also referred to CPSC. The consumer is not aware of anything that is being done in her community related to this problem. The consumer's plan is to deal with the problem and get it fixed. She added at the conclusion of the interview that she is living in a house worth nothing, but continuing to pay a mortgage and insurance.

#### **Product Identification**

The product involved appears to be imported drywall from China. While conducting the on-site interview this investigator saw visible signs of corrosion and blackening on copper pipes and wires. Metal surfaces throughout the home also show visible signs of pitting and tarnishing. There is a noticeable sulfur odor in the entrance of the house. These symptoms have been associated with the presence of imported drywall from China. This investigator photographed labeling located on the back of the drywall found in the attic space above the garage.


This letter is to respond to your claim for loss to your home under Policy No. HO issued to you by AmFed National Insurance Company (AmFed National) and is to advise you, in writing, of AmFed National's coverage decision considering the terms of your policy and the facts surrounding your claim.

As we understand your claim, you are seeking payment under your policy for removal and replacement of the Chinese drywall and for damage to the residence and personal property caused by the gases emitted from the drywall. For the reasons discussed below, AmFed National regrets to advise you that it must respectfully deny your claim for loss or damage to your residence and personal property caused by or attributable to the Chinese drywall as the claim is not covered by your policy. As a result, AmFed National will not make any payment for your claimed loss and damage.

We have attempted to set forth below a summary explanation of the basis for our denial of your claim.

#### **Facts**

In May of 2009, you reported to AmFed National damage to your residence and personal property you believe was caused by or attributable to Chinese-manufactured sheetrock installed in your home during its construction. Specifically, you reported damage



to the home's HVAC system, electrical system, personal property and appliances. According to you, this damage began in or about May of 2007 at which time the air conditioning coils inside the dwelling failed and the copper coils were replaced.

#### **Policy Provisions**

AmFed National Insurance Company issued Policy No. to and for a residence located at policy's effective period is from 11-9-2008 to 12-9-2009. As relevant to the claims asserted by you, the policy provides up to \$205,504 in coverage for covered losses to the Residence and \$143,853 in coverage for covered losses to Personal Property.

The policy provisions relevant to our coverage decision are as follows:

#### **Discussion of Coverage**

Interpreting the terms of your insurance policy liberally and in favor of providing coverage wherever it may be applicable, we have set forth below a summary of our coverage decision supporting the denial of coverage for your claim for loss or damage to your residence and personal property you contend was caused by or attributable to the Chinese drywall/sheetrock installed in your residence.

#### Loss or damage to your Residence


In order for coverage to apply to your residence, it must have sustained a "direct physical loss". There is no coverage under your policy for your claims for loss or damage to your residence including the cost to remove or replace the Chinese drywall because your residence did not sustain a "direct physical loss" as no tangible damage occurred to the residence itsel. No physical, tangible change occurred to the Chinese drywall installed in



your residence. Investigation of your residence revealed that the drywall in place in your residence is in the same condition as it was when installed. Its shape, size or condition has not changed since its installation. Instead, and as we understand the problem with the drywall is that it is emitting a gas that has a bad odor and that is also causing the damages you have reported to fixtures and personal property.

Even if we assume for purposes of analyzing coverage under your policy that the defects in the drywall that are causing these problems meet the policy's requirement of "direct physical loss", then that loss is excluded from coverage by the express terms of your policy. The applicable exclusions are quoted above under your policy headings: "Pollutants", "Error, Omissions, and Defects", and "Wear and Tear". These exclusions and how they apply to your claims to exclude coverage are briefly explained below.

- (1) "POLLUTANTS" exclusion: This policy provision applies to exclude coverage under your policy for any loss you claim to your residence to be caused by or attributable to the gases emitted from the Chinese drywall. As we understand your claim, you contend these gases are the reason the drywall needs to be removed and replaced and are also responsible for causing the damage to your fixtures and personal property. These gases fall within the definition of "Pollutant" and your policy expressly excludes coverage for loss to your residence caused by "pollutants".
- (2) "IRRORS, OMISSIONS AND DEFECTS" exclusion: This policy provision applies to exclude coverage for any loss to your residence you claim that is related to or caused by a defect in the materials used in the construction of your residence. Specifically, this provision excludes coverage for any losses to the actual structure itself, including the drywall as well as any built in components and fixtures of your residence. This exclusion applies to, but is not limited to, the losses you claim to the HVAC system and electrical equipment and fixtures in your residence.
- (3) "IVEAR AND TEAR" exclusion: This policy provision also applies to exclude coverage for any loss you claim to the residence relating to the Chinese drywall as any such loss would be considered to be caused by or related to the "inherent vice" and/or "latent defects" of the drywall both of which are excluded.



#### Personal Property Claims

As noted above, your policy provided coverage against "direct physical loss" to personal property under Coverage C "caused by the following perils, unless the loss is excluded under the Exclusions That Apply to Property Coverages". For a loss to be covered under Coverage C not only must the property suffer a direct physical loss, but that loss must also be caused by one or more of the named perils listed a. through q., i.e., by Fire or Lightning, et al.

There is no coverage under your policy for your claims for any loss to any personal property in your home, including, but not limited to, any damage or loss to your refrigerator, computers, stereo system, or TV's as any such loss was not caused by any one or more of the named perils.

#### Reservation of Rights

By investigating your claim and writing this letter responding to and denying your claim, AmFed does not waive or relinquish any right that it may have under the terms and conditions of your insurance policy. The discussion of any specific policy terms, definitions, exclusions, rights or defenses should not be interpreted as a waiver of any rights or defenses under your policy or applicable law that AmFed may now have or which may hereafter become available. Nothing stated in this letter and no action taken by AmFed, its actorneys or representatives is intended to nor shall it be deemed as a waiver of any of AmFed's rights under its policy or relevant law, whether stated or not stated herein. It is the specific intent of AmFed to reserve and preserve all of its rights and defenses under the terms and conditions of the applicable policy.

This investigation was based on a Consumer Incident Report (Document # 10940364A) that reported health issues to the two residents possibly caused by drywall building materials fully identified below under the product Information caption. The information in this report was obtained from an on-site visit and interview of the Complainant on 05/07/2009. Additional information was obtained from a personal visit and interview on 05/22/2009 of the Store Manager of the National Home Improvement Store identified as where the drywall was purchased.

Complainant is a 47 year old female who indicated that she is not taking any medications or had any medical conditions described below prior to June/July 2008. The other resident is a 52 year old male who also indicated he is not taking any medications or had any medical conditions described below prior to Jun/July 2008. Both stated they live a healthy lifestyle and do not take any medications. There are no other persons living in this home. Complainant disclosed that because of the extreme heat in the region and not having air conditioning in the building they usually lived in the building from approximately September/October to about April/May. She stated that in the summer of 2008 they lived in their camper while they built additions to the building.

The residence where this on-site investigation was conducted is a steel building approximately 50 feet by 75 feet that was built by the Complainant and her Spouse. Complainant stated that they built this home themselves because of the extreme remote location of the property. Complainant said the building was completed in about 2003 and was used as both a residence and art studio. She related that all of the art supplies and material are stored at the east end of the building and the west side is used as the living quarters. Both related that the there is no carpeting in the building and the added rooms and storage area are the only places in the building that any drywall has been used. The remainder of the interior of the building is the metal beams and exterior walls. They related that the only wood structure in the building is the frame work for the additions they added with the drywall. They stated the ground floor is bare concrete. Complainants Spouse also related he installed all of the electrical wiring in the building himself. He also indicated that the building is powered by solar cells he installed himself. The batteries use to power the residence are located in a room adjacent to the main building. Complainants Spouse also disclosed that the only non-electrical appliance in the home is a propane stove with the fuel tank being located outside of the building.

Complainant reported that in about May 2008 they purchased approximately 110 sheets of 12 foot by four foot by one half inch drywall at the Home Improvement Store closest to their residence to build a bedroom and enclosed office. She indicated they paid approximately \$1,000.00 for the drywall. Complainant said that they finished the project in June/July 2008. She also related they used an environmentally friendly paint (also identified below) to finish the bedroom. The enclosed office was not painted due to the health problems that started appearing a few months later.

Complainant stated that in June/July 2008 they left the residence for about two months due to the extreme heat. She stated that when they returned to the residence they began sleeping in the bedroom on a nightly basis and using the office regularly. She said that about shortly after returning in about Sept

2008 both she and her Spouse began noticing a slight smell of rotten eggs and they both began to get ill. Complainant said she began having trouble sleeping, developed almost daily headaches, a soreness that she felt behind her eyes, and her voice began getting hoarse. Her Spouse stated he began getting a bloody nose on weekly basis, constant headaches, watery eyes, and felt run down on a daily basis.

Complainant said that the above describe symptoms slowly developed over a one to two week period. She stated that after researching on the internet and hearing about the possibly toxic drywall being found they decided to live in their camper to see if the symptoms would go away. Complainant commented that one week after living in the camper the symptoms for both of them went away. She indicated that within five to ten days after moving back into the building the symptoms returned. Complainant stated they have since move back into the camper and the symptoms have not returned.

Complainant related that for a short time they had the camper parked immediately next to the exterior wall where the rooms had been built and occasionally she would still smell the rotten egg odor. Both Complainant and her spouse reported that the smell seemed to be stronger late at night and early in the morning when the humidity was higher. They indicated that when they opened the two large sliding doors located on the South and North ends of the building to allow the warm air into the building the smell would not be as strong or even non- existent.

Complainant indicated that because neither have medical insurance have not sought medical treatment for the symptoms described above. Complainants Spouse said that after reading about the possible electrical problems reported on the internet with the drywall issue, he turned off the power to the room additions. During this on-site interview the electrical outlets both in the room additions and the rest of the home were examined by this investigator and Complainants Spouse. No corrosion was noted on any of the wiring. Complainants Spouse disclosed that when he was using the office addition he noticed his laptop computer would flicker but he attributed that to the batteries from his solar power system going flat. He said that when they were sleeping in the bedroom addition they never noticed any flickering lights in the bedroom.

Both individuals confirmed that neither have noticed any pitting or corrosion on jewelry or metal trim in the home. Complainant said that they contacted the local health department and were told they were unaware of any health issues related to installed drywall. They also said that their closest neighbors are approximately two miles away and they have no contact with them. Complainant said the homes in this area have been built at different times and none were built by the same builder. Complainant said they have contacted the National Home Improvement Store where they purchased the drywall and were told that they are unaware of safety issues with any of the drywall they sell. She said that for now they intend on staying out of the building as much as possible. As for long term plans, they both said that they don't know what to do since they cannot afford to remove and replace they drywall in the building.

On 5/22/2009 the Store Manager of the National Home Improvement Store where the drywall was purchased was interviewed. He indicated he had talked to Complainant about her problem and had telephonically contacted the corporate office. He stated he was told that they were aware of several

consumer complaints about the drywall identified below. He said he was told the matter was researched and that drywall used by Complainant was considered to be safe. The Store Manager further said that drywall he sells in his store is usually purchased for him by a company merchandiser located in North Carolina. The Manager also stated he is unaware of any other customers complaining about the drywall sold at his store. At the time of this visit this store did not carry any of the drywall brand involved in this consumer incident report.

Telephonic contact with the Lead Merchandiser for the National Home Improvement Store branch where the involved drywall was purchased disclosed that she has been in contact with five manufacturers who provide drywall to this retailer. She provided letters she received from the manufacturers indicated they do not sell imported drywall (see attachment #5). She related that she buys directly from these manufacturers and is aware of the ongoing investigations involving various types of drywall.




Photo 1 of 7-Interior photograph of room built by the Complainant using (b)(3):CPSA Section 6 (b)

and rooms were constructed by the Complainant and her partner. Full length sheets were 1/2 in.(T) X 12 ft. (L) X 4 ft. (W).




Photo 2 of 7- Art supply storage room built by Complainant and her partner using (b)(3):CPSA Section 25(c)




Photo 4 of 7Interior view of




Photo 5 of 7- Close-up of imprinted information located on the (b)(3):CPSA Section 6(b)




Photo 6 of 7Marking legible on




This letter shall serve as American Gypsum Company's response to your letter dated July 22, 2009 to the President of American Gypsum. In that letter you stated that the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission (the "Commission") has identified certain records (enclosed with your letter) about American Gypsum's products as responsive to Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") requests sent to the Commission. In addition to the FOIA requests, your letter also contained materials relating to two (2) consumer complaints. We have reviewed the information and submit the following comments:

#### Complaint #090504CBB1657

First, American Gypsum Company manufactures all of its wallboard in the United States. American Gypsum has not imported, relabeled or rebranded any wallboard from China or any where else outside the United States.

With respect to the substance of the complaint, we believe it is important to note that this incident report seems to indicate that Chinese wallboard in conjunction with U.S. manufactured wallboard was used in the development in which the home is located. In particular, the text of the complaint describes a statement from the chairman of the housing development's ad hoc homeowner's committee that up to 25% of the homes in that development have had to replace

wallboard was installed in the attic of the consumer's home, it is important to note that during the 2004-2006 time frame, when wallboard was in short supply, it was not unusual for distributors to stock homes with multiple brands of wallboard. In other words, it is possible for a home to have both Chinese wallboard in some areas and U.S. wallboard (like American Gypsum wallboard) in others. However, it appears that the consumer has not performed a thorough inspection of the other areas of the consumer's home to determine the source of wallboard throughout the home.

## Complaint #090504CBB3555

We have no comment on this complaint as it involves wallboard manufactured by National Gypsum Company.

Dear Mr. Stevenson:

This letter is in response to your July 22, 2009 correspondence to United States Gypsum Company regarding the above referenced FOIA requests. We have reviewed all the documents enclosed with your letter, which include the FOIA requests and the CPSC files that the commission is considering producing in response.

United States Gypsum Company has the following comments for your consideration:

1. First, we want to make clear that United States Gypsum Company has never manufactured wallboard in China. Our SHEETROCK® brand gypsum drywall has always been manufactured in North America only. Therefore, we believe that to the extent any CPSC documents mention wallboard made by U.S. Gypsum Company, those documents are not responsive to FOIA requests that are specifically directed at CPSC investigations into Chinese drywall.

Second, in more than 90 years of making wallboard, U.S. Gypsum Company has not had complaints about is SHEETROCK® brand drywall similar to those being made regarding Chinese wallboard.

Third, production of some of these documents by the CPSC in response to Chinese wallboard inquiries would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that our company's primary product, SHEETROCK® brand gypsum drywall, may have been manufactured in China or that the CPSC believes our product may cause problems similar to those that some Chinese wallboard apparently has

caused. Neither is true, and nothing in the documents sent to us suggests otherwise.

2. The following are brief comments on each of the six files that you sent to us for review:

No. 090504CBB1656

No comment or objection.

#### No. 09054CBB1662

This investigation file relates to a homeowner who believes that his family has developed numerous health conditions related to Chinese drywall in his home. However, neither the homeowner nor the CPSC investigator was able to locate a label on the drywall to confirm the drywall manufacturer. A letter in the file from drywall supplier Seacoast Supply indicates that it did supply some drywall to the home but that based on the delivery date the drywall delivered was manufactured by U.S. Gypsum Company in the United States and is not Chinese-made drywall.

Because no Chinese drywall has been identified in the home, this investigation file is not responsive to FOIA requests for "Chinese Drywall Files". Further, production of the file at this time – prior to a full inspection of <u>all</u> the wallboard in the home and a full investigation into the health issues described by the homeowners – would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that that the family's health issues are related to U.S. Gypsum wallboard. There is no evidence that this is true and the CPSC file does not reveal any reason to believe that such a suggestion is true.

Therefore, U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

#### No. 090505CBB1683

As with the previous file, this file reports a homeowner complaint that various health symptoms and copper blackening in his house are related to Chinese drywall. Again, there has been no inspection of all of the drywall in the home to confirm the presence of any Chinese material. The only drywall that has been identified in the report is U.S. Gypsum SHEETROCK® brand drywall, which was reportedly visible only in the attic and is not made in China. There is nothing in the file to confirm the presence of any Chinese drywall in the home. We are aware of other homes where Chinese-made ½"drywall was installed in the walls

of home, and U.S. Gypsum or other 5/8" inch drywall was installed in the ceiling or attic (5/8 inch wallboard typically is used on ceilings, while walls are typically ½ inch board).

Production of this complaint file before a full inspection of <u>all</u> the wallboard in the home and before a full investigation into the health issues described by the homeowners, would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that the family's health issues are related to U.S. Gypsum wallboard.

If any of this homeowner's alleged problems are caused by wallboard in the home, it is more likely that the problems are caused by undiscovered Chinese wallboard than by U.S. Gypsum Company wallboard, which has never been associated with the complaints being made regarding Chinese drywall.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

## No. 090505C1688

This investigation was initiated by a tenant who complained of health issues and copper blackening in her rented home. The manufacturer of the drywall in the home is not confirmed; however, the tenant believes her problems are related to Chinese drywall. As with prior claims addressed herein, the only drywall that was accessible and inspected was located in the attic of the home.

There has been no confirmation that any wallboard in the home was manufactured in China and no investigation into what may be causing the tenant's complaints. Because there is only one unverified reference to U.S. Gypsum Company wallboard in the file, production of these documents by the CPSC in response to FOIA requests would unfairly and inaccurately suggest that U.S. Gypsum wallboard may be a part of the tenant's problems – and there is nothing either in the file or outside the file to support that suggestion.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

#### No. 090520CBB2638

This file relates to an investigation into a homeowner complaint of health symptoms and electrical component failures that the homeowner believes might be related to Chinese drywall. The CPSC investigator found no evidence of Chinese drywall – although he did obtain information (a purchase receipt

produced by the homeowner) that suggests that some of the drywall in the house was manufactured by two U.S. companies – United States Gypsum and Georgia Pacific. However, there was no visual confirmation that the wallboard in the home was in fact manufactured by the two companies. The investigator did <u>not</u> notice any unusual smell in the home and found <u>no</u> visible blackening of copper wire or other metal surfaces – the symptoms frequently reported in homes with the Chinese drywall problems.

There is no evidence of Chinese drywall in the home, the CPSC investigator did not observe any unusual smell or copper blackening, and there is no evidence that the wallboard in the home is causing any problems whatsoever. Therefore, this report is not responsive to the FOIA request. Production of these material in response to the pending FOIA requests may inaccurately suggest that the homeowner's reported problems are related to the presence of wallboard manufactured by two U.S. manufacturers, and there is nothing to support that conclusion.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

We built four rooms using this Dry Wall. We were both involved in the handling cutting and installing of the Dry Wall. We moved into one room to sleep and within two months we were experiencing headaches, extreme sinus problems, got almost everyday night during this time), shortness of breath when laying down to sleep, insomnia, hourse voice like the beginning stages of larvagitis (although Jane did not have a cold) and lung irritation. Basically during the three and a half months sleeping in this room our health began to drastically deteriorate. At three in the morning one morning Jane said: we have to leave this room NOW! We moved out of this room...and could not figure out what was the problem. Jane kept smelling this stinky garbage type smell ((b) could not smell anything because he his nose was so congested) and could not find where it was coming from bift she did smell it more strongly if she put her nose up to the wall. This rotten smell had permeated our sheets blankets so much that we had to wash everything that had been in that room during this time. We thought that there might be something toxic coming from the paint, so we spent the next three months in our free time, peeling off the paint from the walls in this room. Then we repainted the walls with a green environmentally healthy No VOC paint from Sherwinn Williams called Harmony. In the meantime, we slept in our camper and noticed that within a week we could fall asleep easily and (b)(3) severe congestion bloody nose subsided and my lungs felt better. Although we had been using one of the Computer Rooms everyday 10am to 7 pm during this entire time, we still had a headache at the end of the day, Anyway...We moved back to sleep in this room. Twenty days later, thoroughly exhausted from lack of sleep, headaches, congestion, lung irritation and overall fatigue we moved out of the room again. Just before we moved out of the room I noticed that my vision was blurry both far away and close up, which I thought was very strange since I have very good eyesight, I do not wear glasses or have ever worn glasses. Again our health was deteriorating since we had slept in this room, so, we stopped sleeping in that room. At first we were just concerned about the Bedroom. What could the problem be? we thought, A&a,¬A" It couldn't be something in our insulation because we had purposely gone out of our way to find an insulation that had no formaldehyde and no toxins in it. Nevertheless, we decided that we would send our insulation to a lab to have it tested. In the process of looking for a lab to test our Insulation, a man from one of the labs called us. He asked us what the situation was, we told him, and he said that he highly doubts that the problem was in our insulation, but instead he thought it would be in our Dry Wall. Then he told us about Toxic Dry Wall and to look it up online. We did...and found out the symptoms such as frequent burn out of light bulbs and electronic problems such as our new computer was having mini black outs that we could not figure out why...and the health problems people were having were just like ours! Interestingly enough, because we are busy people and home builders, we only putty and painted one room: the room that we were going to and did sleep in. In our research we called Louis's and they said that their Dry Wall manufacturers never imported any Dry Wall. And we also read th(b)(a):CPSA section 2 ogo. And we also read th(b)(a):CPSA or when one will be completely visible...and what is left of half of the completely visible...and half everyone is in an uproar about Chinese Toxic Dry Wall, for National to just say, we did not import any Dry Wall is like the Fox getting the Hunter to start chasing after a bird. 






The information in this report was obtained through the homeowners during an on-site interview conducted on August 21, 2009. The EH&E team were present at this home on the same day conducting testing. This investigation was initiated as part of the on-going drywall investigation, in which this home was classified as a control home during the indoor air quality study.

The complainants are a husband (57-years-old, hereinafter referred to as the male complainant) and a wife (56 years-old, hereinafter referred to as the female complainant), who live in a three-story plantation style home, built on a concrete slab. The home has approximately 7,258 square feet of living space available, with a total of approximately 8,336 square feet under roof. The exterior of the home is stucco and brick. The home has five bedrooms, 4 ½ baths, and an enclosed garage. Ceiling heights in the residence range from 9-12 feet. The 3 bedrooms located on the third floor of the residence are carpeted; with the remainder of the flooring being either hardwood or stained concrete. The home is piped for natural gas, which is utilized by the two fireplaces, stove, and two water heaters. The home has hard wired smoke alarms which are monitored by a home monitoring service.

The male complainant is a developer of the subdivision where the involved residence is located. Approximately 200 homes are located in the subdivision on 1,700 acres. The male complainant acted as the contractor during the construction of his home. Construction began on the home in late 2004. Wood studs were used during construction. The involved product, drywall, was installed in the home and painted in approximately April of 2005. The complainants moved into the home in August of 2005. No repair work has been performed since the home's initial construction. Neither were any changes made to the residence by the complainants (i.e painting, carpet installation, etc.)

#### Neither complainant has noticed, experienced or reported:

- Health issues or symptoms since moving into the residence
- Unusual problems with appliances or electrical equipment
- Problems (or corrosion) in the central air conditioner (no low refrigerant levels, no coils or components replaced)
- Electrical problems (i.e. flickering lights, circuit breakers tripping, arcs in electrical system)
- Corrosion on jewelry
- Corrosion on faucets or showerheads

During the on-site visit, this Investigator did a visual inspection of the exposed drywall in the attic of the residence. None of the exposed drywall had labeling indicating that it had been imported from China. A sulfur odor was not detected anywhere in the residence. The copper tubing exposed in the attic appeared to be free of black residue and did not appear to be corroded. Copper wiring in several receptacles and light switches in the residence were also visually inspected during the on-site and were found to be copper






Photo 3 shows a close-up view of an apparent manufacture date printed on the back of drywall installed in the attic of the residence.




Photo 4 shows a view of one of the water heaters located in the upstairs attic of the residence. The copper piping did not have evidence of corrosion or blackening.




Photo 5 shows a close-up view of the copper piping on the water heater shown in Photo 4.



This investigation was initiated from a consumer complainant.

Much of the information contained in this report was obtained during an on-site interview conducted with the complainant on May 13, 2009. While at the complainant's home, I photographed evidence of corrosion reportedly caused by the incident product. In addition, I photographed small portions of the labeling from the incident product. These photographs are included as Attachment 2.

While conducting the on-site visit, I provided the complainant with copies of the CPSC Authorization for Release of Name Form and Medical Release Form. The complainant stated that she wished to review these items with her husband before signing them. She provided a signed copy of the Authorization for Release of Name form, which was received June 3, 2009. Signed copies of the Medical Release forms were not received.

During the on-site visit, the complainant stated that this incident was also being investigated by the state department of health and hospitals. On May 21, 2009, I requested a copy of the investigation report and photographs from that agency. These items were received June 4, 2009. The photographs are included as Attachment 3, and the report is included as Attachment 4.

The complainant also provided an e-mail outlining a brief history of the problems her family has experienced in this incident. This document was received May 15, 2009, and is included as Attachment 5.

This incident occurred at the complainant's residence, a two-story single-family dwelling (Attachment 2, Photograph 1; Attachment 3, Photograph 1). The size of the house involved is approximately 3500 to 3600 square feet. The second floor of the house is carpeted, but the first floor is not.

The primary product involved in this incident is drywall imported from China. This drywall was installed in the first floor of the complainant's home in 2006 when the first floor was gutted and rebuilt following flooding that occurred in August and September 2005. The complainant and her husband stated that new drywall was installed throughout the entire first floor of the house at this time (Attachment 4, Page 2).

The complainant stated wood studs were used in the construction of the house. She said that the studs were treated after the house flooded in 2005 and that she and her husband received a certificate stating that the studs were mold-free.

The incident location is equipped with natural gas service. The complainant stated that the range, the water heater, and the central heating unit are all gas-powered appliances.

As stated above, the complainant and her husband had to gut and remodel the entire first floor of their house following extensive flooding in the area in 2005. The complainant stated that she did not wish to disclose contact information for the subcontractor who installed the drywall when the house was remodeled.

The complainant and her husband both stated that they did not know where the subcontractor had purchased the drywall installed in their house in 2006.

The complainant stated that she and her family moved into the house in July 2006, when the rebuilding of the first floor was completed (Attachment 4, Page 2).

The complainant stated that she noticed a strange odor right away in the first-floor storage closet underneath the stairs (Attachment 4, Page 2). During the on-site visit, she said that the odor reminded her of "stinky wood." She indicated that she also noticed a similar odor in the first-floor game room sometimes when it had been closed up for a while (Attachment 4, Page 2).

The strange odor is stronger in the summer, according to the complainant. In addition, the odor is more noticeable when the air conditioner is not running, she stated (Attachment 4, Page 2).

In the summer of 2008, the complainant's eleven-year-old son began having severe headaches (Attachment 4, Page 4). The complainant stated that she also began having severe headaches during the summer of 2008 (Attachment 4, Page 4). She indicated that the headache symptoms that she and her older son experienced improved when the weather turned cooler and were beginning to worsen again as warmer weather returned.

The complainant's six-year-old son began having nosebleeds and coughing up bloody mucous in the winter of 2008. During the on-site visit, the complainant stated that this problem continues to occur occasionally (Attachment 4, Page 4).

The complainant said that her husband is also beginning to have unexplained headaches. She said that his headaches began in May 2009.

When the family was away from their home on vacation in 2008, they noticed that the symptoms they were experiencing disappeared on the second or third day away. The complainant stated that the symptoms returned when they returned home after their vacation.

The complainant stated that she and both children sought medical treatment for the symptoms they were experiencing. I requested that CPSC be allowed to obtain a copy of the medical records pertaining to the treatment received by each family member. However, the completed Medical Release Form was not returned to CPSC.

The complainant stated that she and her husband have experienced several problems with appliances in the house unexpectedly ceasing to function properly. She said that the lamp in the television room downstairs went out about a year and a half ago (Attachment 4, Page 4). In addition, the lamp in the master bedroom (directly above the other television) began having problems at approximately the same time. The complainant said

that they had the lamp in the television room replaced after it went out but that it is now beginning to have problems again.

In addition to the symptoms reported above, the complainant and her husband are concerned about potential long-term health problems arising from fumes associated with chemicals believed to be in the drywall installed in the first floor of their home when it was remodeled.

In the summer of 2008, the complainant and her husband had to replace the refrigerator that they had purchased in November 2005 (Attachment 4, Page 4).

The complainant said that the circuit board on the gas oven went out in December 2008. Although they had it replaced, the problem began again three or four months later, according to the complainant. She said that they have to use the outside circuit breaker to turn the oven on and off every time they cook anything in it (Attachment 4, Page 4).

The incident residence is equipped with two central air conditioning units. According to the complainant, both units had to be recharged about once a month during the summer. She said that the freon is replaced about once a year, with the last replacement being a couple of weeks prior to the on-site visit (Attachment 4, Page 2).

The complainant indicated that a family friend cane to the residence recently and charged the coils of both air conditioning units. She said that this service was provided at no cost and that the friend did not give them a bill or a service record.

During the yearly service visit last year, the air conditioning contractor told the complainant and her husband that the downstairs unit had a freon leak and that the coils in that unit needed to be replaced (Attachment 4, Page 2). The complainant said that they have not replaced the coils in the downstairs unit, due to the ongoing issues that they believe are caused by fumes generated from the Chinese drywall. The complainant did not provide a copy of the service record for this visit.

The report provided by the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals indicates that black corrosion was observed on the compressed freon line from the air conditioning unit for the first floor (Attachment 4, Page 2; Attachment 3, Photographs 9-12).

The complainant said that she and her husband have noticed several instances of corrosion that they believe is caused by emissions from the drywall in the lower floor of the home. The hot water line on the gas water heater has begun to blacken (Attachment 2, Photograph 6; Attachment 3, Photographs 3-4; Attachment 4, Page 3). In addition, they have noticed corrosion on plumbing valves in the kitchen (Attachment 4, Page 3; Attachment 3, Photograph 6).

The complainant stated that she has also noticed corrosion on her stainless steel kitchen knives (Attachment 2, Photograph 7; Attachment 3, Photographs 5; Attachment 4, Page 3). During the on-site visit, the complainant pointed out two other instances of corrosion

that she believes might be related to the drywall: the sink area of the wet bar downstairs (Attachment 2, Photograph 8) and a stainless steel toilet paper caddy in a bathroom directly above a vent coming from the first floor (Attachment 2, Photograph 9).

The electrical wiring in the house also shows signs of corrosion, according to the complainant and her husband. She pointed out one instance of corrosion behind the receptacle in the kitchen/breakfast area of the house (Attachment 2, Photograph 10). The Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals indicates that the complainant has experienced black corrosion of electrical outlets in the laundry room and kitchen (Attachment 4, Page 3; Attachment 3, Photographs 7-8).

# CONTACT WITH RETAILER AND MANUFACTURER:

At the time of the on-site visit, neither the complainant nor her husband had contacted the manufacturer or installer of the drywall involved in the incident. When I spoke with the complainant via telephone on June 2, 2009, she indicated that they still had not contacted the manufacturer or installer.

#### PRODUCT IDENTIFICATION:

The primary product involved is **drywall, manufactured by Knauf Drywall.** During the on-site visit, I was unable to locate or photograph a portion of the drywall on which the entire manufacturer's name was visible. However, I was able to photograph a portion of the labeling on the incident drywall (Attachment 2, Photographs 2-5; Attachment 3, Photograph 2). This partial labeling, along with the distinctive color pattern used by the manufacturer, indicates that the drywall installed in the first floor of the complainant's residence was manufactured by Knauf Drywall. 






Photograph 1: Incident location







Photograph 3: Second view of Chinese drywall in under-stair storage closet at incident location




Photograph 4: Drywall pieces cut from first floor storage closet area of incident location






















Photograph 10: Blackening on copper compressed Freon line (LA DHH)

My name is Shannon Schulz and I am married with two children; an 11 year old son and a 6 year old son. Unfortunately, my family and I are victims of having purchased the Chinese Drywall. We live in St. Bernard Parish in Meraux, LA. When we remodeled our home after Hurricane Katrina, we hired a company based out of Houston, Texas to hang and float the sheetrock. We moved back into our house in July, 2006. Since that time, we have had to replace our refrigerator, replace 1 upstairs television, replace the tube (lamp) on our big screen television downstairs (twice) and replace the computer chip on our oven just this past winter. Our oven is currently giving us problems again. The *cancel* button will not work, so my husband actually has to go outside to turn the oven off by the breaker box. We have had someone service our a/c unit last summer because it was also not working properly. We need to have the coils replaced on the unit and there is also a leak which needs to be fixed. If I would have put the pieces of the puzzle together then, surely I would have seen that there was a much bigger problem than just the appliances giving us problems. The mystery has now been solved...my husband cut a piece of our drywall to check the backside markings and, of course, it is labeled **KNAUF.** The label is blue and yellow. We have checked behind the electrical boxes and the ground wire (copper wire) is black. If you are not familiar with the Chinese Drywall, the drywall is emitting sulfur-based gases that are corroding the air-conditioner coils, electrical wiring, electronics and the appliances. If this gas can corrode copper, what is it doing to our health and our children's health?

#### My concerns are:

- 1. My youngest son has started having nose bleeds and asthmatic symptoms.
- 2. My oldest son and I have been suffering with headaches.

### My questions are:

- 1. How harmful is this to myself and my family?
- 2. Being that my husband subcontracted our house, who is liable for this? This is **not** covered by our homeowners insurance.

# What steps have I taken:

- 1. I have contacted the Attorney General's Office and gave them all pertinent information and they advised me to contact America's Watchdog.
- 2. I have contacted America's Watchdog and they have forwarded my information to their contacts in Washington D.C.
- 3. I have called the Louisiana Department of Health and Hospitals.
- 4. I have called my insurance company and placed a claim through my homeowners insurance.

- 5. Our doctor has ordered that blood work and chest x-rays be done on my family.
- 6. I have contacted Fox 8 News.
- 7. I have spoken to someone in Senator Landrieu's office.
- 8, I have contacted an editor with the Wall Street Journal and they will do a follow-up story on this issue.

### What steps do I plan to take:

I plan to get an estimate from a contractor on gutting the house (2<sup>nd</sup> time in 3 years). There is a chance that the house will have to be bulldozed, so we will need to get an estimate on that as well. How can we resolve this problem?

I have lots of questions, but feel like no one can give us any answers. The only way people in our situation can get answers and correct this problem is if we spread the word. Who allowed this to enter our Country? In the end, who is ultimately responsible for this problem? The federal government has a responsibility to correct this problem and assist with the repair costs. We need answers. When do I need to start the process of gutting the house or does it need to be bulldozed? What should I do with my family? Please contact our Senators, Attorney General, local and national news stations; send them our story. We cannot let this go unresolved. Someone needs to take responsibility for this problem.

It's unthinkable in a country that leads the world there are <u>not measurements</u>, <u>checks</u> and balances to prevent dangerous building materials from being imported. Where is our protection? Does no one care what is being allowed to be sold on the streets of the United States? But in this case, there are not and hence, here we are. What type of damage has occurred to these families because of this? What will be the costs to their health or emotionally and financially? And how many people have now been affected by this? How many times do we have to be reactive because our government has let us down, disappointed us i.e. levees, FEMA, this? Regardless, we are strong and we do not coward when faced time and time again (within 3+ years) with life changing challenges. # 1.Sun-Sentinel-Chinese Drywall: HUD Secretary Tours Homes with Chinese Drywall By Paul Owers

The nation's top housing official on Tuesday toured homes near <u>Boynton Beach</u> that are tainted with Chinese drywall, promising weary and impatient residents "help is on the way."

That aid could include loan modifications and federal money for repairs, said Shaun Donovan, secretary for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. He expects the first results from a series of air-quality tests in affected homes nationwide to be released later this month.

Once federal and state officials "know the science" behind the drywall problem, HUD can respond by offering grant money for home renovations, Donovan said. The agency also may be able to work with lenders to write off principal loan balances and interest payments for homeowners who have the drywall.

"We will get you answers as quickly as possible," Donovan said during a news conference on the front lawn of a two-story home in the gated Cobblestone Creek development off Lyons Road.

About 70 residences in the 500-home community have Chinese drywall. Homeowners seemed encouraged by Donovan's visit.

"Any relief would be a step in the right direction," said Jeff Koc, 38. "All of us are suffering in one way or another."

More than 100,000 homes nationwide, including 36,000 in Florida, are believed to have the imported wallboard, which corrodes wiring, copper pipes, appliances and metals. Most builders have refused to fix the homes, and lenders and property insurers have offered little or no relief.

Homeowners say they are financially and emotionally devastated.

State and federal health officials have yet to determine whether the drywall is responsible for nosebleeds, respiratory problems and other symptoms reported by homeowners.

U.S. Rep. Ron Klein, D-Boca Raton, one of several lawmakers who toured the homes with Donovan, sympathizes with residents frustrated by the delays in releasing test results. But he said a comprehensive review into what's causing the problem and how to fix it takes time. "You have to do it right," he said.

Cobblestone Creek residents Nick and Heather DeSola told Donovan they hired a contractor to remove their drywall.

The home has remained exposed since the summer, and the DeSolas and their two children live in a nearby rental, waiting for officials to come up with a definitive plan for fixing a home with Chinese drywall.

"We're in limbo, for sure," said Heather DeSola, 37.

Her next-door neighbor, Steven Roberts, a veterinarian, still is living in his home with his wife and 16-month-old daughter. He said he can't afford to move out because the sagging economy has cut his income by 40 percent.

"We are simply left with choices, none of them good," said Roberts, 35.

He also expressed another frustration: trying to get the county property appraiser to cut the value of his home, reducing the taxes he pays.

He said it's been a "burdensome process" to provide proof of the drywall to <u>Palm Beach County Property Appraiser</u> Gary Nikolits. What's more, Roberts said, it's unclear how much value Nikolits will knock off his home.

In Broward County, Property Appraiser Lori Parrish is preparing to cut values of homes with Chinese drywall by 50 percent.

Like Nikolits, Parrish has asked for proof in the form of photos, denied insurance claims and letters from builders. Her office also wants contractor estimates of what it would cost to fix the homes, although officials say estimates were never required.

Jacci Clary of Coconut Creek said Parrish's office told her to get a repair estimate, but she refused. She was put off by the cost, about \$300, and said estimates are worthless anyway because there is no established protocol for fixing a home with the bad drywall.

"I wasn't going to keep throwing more money into the house," said Clary, 45, a nurse. "This is just another hurdle we have to kick our way through."

# 2.Palm Beach Post-U.S. HUD Secretary Visits West Boynton Beach Community Hit by Chinese Drywall By Allison Ross

It's not every day that you see a group of government officials clustered around a microphone in the middle of a well-manicured front lawn in your suburban neighborhood.

But the sight of legislators and news cameras has become an almost commonplace sight to the Cobblestone Creek development west of Boynton Beach - a community both media-weary and hopeful that public attention of their defective drywall plight will bring them answers and results.

Today, U.S. Housing and Urban Development Secretary Shaun Donovan became the latest high-profile visitor to the affluent neighborhood.

With him came U.S. Reps. Robert Wexler, Mario Diaz-Balart and Ron Klein, as well as state Sen. Ted Deutch and Palm Beach County Commissioner Burt Aaronson.

"It's hard, but at this point, the more positive exposure we can get about our situation, the better," said (b) (3):CPSA who opened his home to Donovan and the others (b) tives in one of the estimated 70 homes in the community that have been found to contain defective Chinese wallboard.

Houses in Cobblestone Creek were being bought for more than \$600,000 a few years ago, but recently one with Chinese drywall sold for just \$190,000.

Residents who came to the event told officials stories of strange sulfuric odors permeating their homes, of jewelry and metal wiring that would mysteriously corrode after only months, of inexplicable nosebleeds and health problems that went away when they left the house for a few days.

They told of not being able to afford to leave their homes, of wanting to replace the drywall but of being afraid to do so without proper protocols, of being upside down in their mortgages.

Donovan pledged today to help get relief for affected homeowners as soon as possible.

"There's a range of resources and potential solutions," Donovan said, adding that a lot depends on the results of drywall testing that is expected to be released at the end of this month.

The legislators also pledged their help in getting answers and aid. Aaronson offered to send county fire marshals to test fire alarms to ensure they hadn't been damaged by corrosion.

For now, though, homeowners are still forced to wait and hope the publicity will make a difference.

"I'm glad they came and saw for themselves," neighbor Maundy Melville said. "I thought no one was listening to us. This is a nightmare."







The information in this report was obtained during a telephone interview with the complainant on May 14, 2009. This investigation was initiated from an internet complaint that was received on March 26, 2009.

The 46 year old female complainant resides in a four bedroom rancher in Gulf Breeze, Florida. The brick home is approximately 3,000 square foot and was built in 1994. It is located roughly two lots away from the Gulf Coast. The complainant moved into the home in 1996. They have not experienced any problems with the home until Hurricane Ivan and Dennis.

On September 16, 2004, Hurricane Ivan came ashore the Gulf Coast of Florida. The complainant's home was flooded with five feet of water. The home was severely damaged and had to be renovated. They replaced the roof, carpet, sink, cabinets and drywall throughout the house. They did not have to replace the nine foot ceiling. The water was in the home for approximately six hours. During the renovation, the complainant stayed in a hotel for approximately two months. There were no injuries. The complainant did not know the exact amount of the property damage, but it was in excessive of over \$100,000.

On October 25, 2004, the complainant purchased several sheets of drywall from a nationwide home improvement retailer. The drywall sheets were installed by a local company. They placed eight feet of drywall throughout the home, and laid the sheets side by side from the floor to the ceiling. There is a foot of molding extending down from the ceiling which did not need to be replaced. The home contained wooden studs.

On July 11, 2005, the complainant's home was flooded again by Hurricane Dennis. A small amount of water seeped into their home. It did not leave a water line. The home experienced minor damage. They replaced the carpets and changed the grout inside the tile floor. They did not have to replace the drywall. The complainant did not have to leave her home during the repairs.

There have been no electrical problems in the home. There were no signs of flickering lights, arcs, sparks, buzzing or sizzling noise. The circuit breaker is working properly.

The complainant felt that the two light switches with dimmers in the living room and dining room were unusually hot to the touch when in use.

There was no damage or corrosion to any of the electrical outlets. There was no odor coming from them. There were no signs of corrosion or any problems with the smoke detectors. They did not have sprinklers in the home.

There were no signs of fire or smoke from any of the appliances.

On March 26, 2009, the complainant contacted the Commission to report that she was experiencing headaches and her home smelled like rotten eggs odor. But she was not sure what was causing them.

During our interview, the complainant described the odor in her home as being similar to the smell of debris or decaying seaweed, not rotten eggs. The smell was primarily in the master bedroom coming from the wall behind her bed. It was stronger during the summer months because of the humidity. She placed three dehumidifiers throughout the home, and operates them from April through November. It has minimized the odor.

The complainants neighbors do not have an odor in their home. They used a different installer. She did not know what type of drywall they used or if they purchased it from the local retailer. She will ask them as soon as possible. She did not have their contact information available. At the time of this report, it has not been forthcoming and has been added to the missing document form. (Exhibit #2)

The complainant stated that she started getting headaches after her dad passed away in June 2007. The headaches are located behind her temple on the left side and she gets sharp pains in her head. In 2008, she started going to a chiropractor and he told her that her headaches were from the bulging disc in her neck and not the drywall. He has been treating her with steroid injections. She has to receive one shot per week for three weeks. She stated that it helps calm down the bulge in her disc, and she is feeling better. The complainant does not suffer from sinuitis.

The complainant has not had her air conditioner, air quality, or drywall tested. She said she may call a heating and air conditioning company to come in and check their central air conditioning system. I asked her to send me a copy of the results of their assessment.

The fireplace, water heater, and furnace are fueled by natural gas. She examined the copper wires in the appliances and they appeared to be in good condition and showed no signs of corrosion.

She has not notified the retailer, builder, or installer of her concerns, but she has notified an attorney who is handling a civil action suit.

The complainant does not know who manufactured the drywall.

On May 21, 2009, this investigator contacted the retailer to determine if they knew who manufactured the dry wall in 2004. The manager stated that they do not keep that information available. He provided two names, saying that it may have been one of them. It is highlighted under the product section.

The complainant verbally stated that she did not want her name released to the general public or to the manufacturer. It has been properly marked on the 182 form. She also listed it on the original internet form.

The complainant did not know the history of the land that her home was built on. But she did know the name of the builder. This investigator requested the builder's name and address. At the time of this report, it has not been forthcoming and has been added to the missing document form. (Exhibit #2)

The complainant was going to email me copies of photographs, purchase receipt, and the name and address of the installer. At the time of this report, they have not been forthcoming and have been added to the missing document form. (Exhibit #2)

This in-depth-investigation was initiated as follow-up to a consumer complaint which reported that the consumer and his wife recently discovered that the home which they had purchased nearly 2 years ago was built with Chinese drywall. It was reported that several members of the family are experiencing some or all of the following symptoms associated with the drywall: sinus problems, headaches, fatigue, red eyes, nose bleeds, itching, and sleep apnea. It was further reported that several of the appliances have sustained damage and some have ceased to function. The consumer reported it due to the serious health concerns.

Information contained in this investigation was obtained from the consumer and his wife during an on-site visit to the home. During this visit, the consumer's wife signed the authorization to release name form (see Exh. 2).

The home is a 1727 square foot 2-story townhouse with 3 bedrooms and 2 bathrooms, made with wood studs and tiled throughout. It was purchased new in May of 2006. The home is occupied by the consumer, his wife and their 3 children; 8 year old girl, and 2 boys, ages 10 and 16. The family moved into the home in June of 2006. No modifications were made other than the repainting of the interior walls throughout. No drywall has been replaced or repaired at any time.

The consumer and his wife reported that as soon as they moved into the home they detected an unidentifiable odor. It was thought for months to have been the smell of new home materials. The odor persists presently and was described by the consumer as the smell of humidity or smoke (though no smoke has ever been observed). The odor has been mostly detected in the downstairs area of the home and became more noticeable to them during the spring of this year (2009). The consumer stated that they were not present during the painting of the interior walls, thus no odors were detected prior to them moving into the home.

It was also reported that as early as July of 2006, they began to feel ill at different times of the day and night. The children also reported to the consumer that they too were feeling ill. The following is a list of physical symptoms felt by each member of the family:

#### Health Effects

Adult, female (33) - headaches, sinus problems, irritated eyes/skin, coughing, insomnia.

Adult, male (37) – sleep apnea (diagnosed), headaches, irritated eyes/skin, insomnia, shortness of breath, numbness in all extremities, ankle pain.

Child, female (8) – headaches, irritated eyes/skin, numbness in legs, asthma.

Child, male (10) – insomnia, nose bleeds, headaches.

Child, male (16) – headaches, sinus problems, runny nose, irritated eyes/skin, coughing, insomnia.

The consumer confirmed that all symptoms mentioned above are felt at all times while in the home, yet intensify during the evening and bed time hours. The consumer himself (adult male) is under medical treatment for the sleep apnea. The 10 year old boy has also been treated for the frequent nose bleeds. Medical reports were requested but have not yet been received.

The consumer confirms that all symptoms either lessen or cease after they have been out of the home for several hours. As a result, the family has been evacuating the home on weekends and renting in local hotels.

The consumer reports that several appliances have been damaged. The following is a list of appliances effected and their current conditions:

#### Appliances Effected

<u>Air conditioner</u> - cools, but freezes, coil rotted. (coil has not been replaced or repaired) A leak has occurred as a result which caused part of the ceiling to collapse. Pieces of the ceiling were removed to prevent further damage and a bucket of water now rests in the living room downstairs to catch the water droplets (see Exh. 6, pg. 2-4).

Refrigerator- stopped working, was replaced

<u>Microwave</u> – stopped working, replaced 3 times...still not functioning properly 20 <u>2006 Sony Television (megapixel)</u> – copper wiring burned, resulting in blurred view (see Exh. 6, pg. 11).

<u>2005 Sony Televisio</u>n – stopped working (not repaired)(a third model TV is also not working)

Ceiling fan -stopped working (not repaired)

The consumer contacted an air conditioning technician who provided a letter regarding the current condition of the ac unit. The letter was requested but has not yet been obtained.

According to the consumer, there has been no fire or smoke in the home. No flickering lights or faulty outlets were either reported or observed. The smoke alarms are in working condition.

This investigator took photographs of observed corrosion as described and pointed out by the consumer (see Exh. 6). Several sink copper pipes and a shower head were observed with discoloration and blackening. Corrosion and rust was observed within the air conditioning unit (see Exh. 6, pg. 25-27). Evidence of tarnishing was observed on jewelry and a set of metal dumbbells (see Exh. 6, pgs. 30-32). Corrosion was also observed on batteries used in remote controls (see Exh. 6, pgs. 33-34).

The consumer reported that the builder contacted them in February in order to perform an air quality assessment. The assessment was performed by toxicologists and hygienists hired by the builder. Results of this assessment were obtained and included as Exhibit 4.

The builder's division president came to the family's residence on 4/28/09 and provided them with a proposed work authorization agreement (see Exh. 5). According to the consumer, the builder has offered to move the entire family to another nearby home of equal size (rent-free) for a period of 4-5 months until all existing drywall is removed and replaced. The consumer has yet to make a decision as to whether or not he will agree with the proposed offer.

The family still resides in the home and at present expressed their uncertainty as to how they will resolve the situation. They continued to express concerns over current and long term health risks and the financial burden this has caused.

It should be noted that during this visit, several neighbors appeared at the residence and voiced their concern over Chinese drywall in their home and the possible health risks and current symptoms they were experiencing. This investigator provided them with appropriate contact information for the CPSC and urged them to report their concerns accordingly.

This investigator conducted an internet search of the building company's website and results are included in Exhibit 8.

An internet search of the residence county property information was conducted and results are shown in Exhibit 7.

#### **Investigator Observations**

During this visit this investigator detected an odor which appeared to smell like burning metal. This visit was primarily conducted on the back yard patio. The odor was present in the patio as well. Approximately 20 minutes into the interview, this investigator began to feel itchy/watery eyes and a scratchy throat accompanied by a sudden unexplained headache and dizziness. This persisted throughout the interview and did not cease until over an hour after leaving the residence.



Lennar Corporation and its affiliates (Lennar) have retained expert toxicologists and industrial hygienists from ENVIRON International Corporation (ENVIRON) to perform an air quality assessment at your residence. As you know, on February 24, 2009, ENVIRON

conducted a preliminary evaluation of your residential property. ENVIRON's preliminary evaluation was undertaken in conjunction with Lennar Homes' inspection of the heating, ventilating and air conditioning (HVAC) system in your home.

This preliminary evaluation consisted of, among other things, the following: (1) a walkthrough of the residence, which confirmed the presence of black surface accumulations on select HVAC system components; (2) the measurement of indoor and outdoor air using a calibrated direct reading hydrogen sulfide analyzer (three readings higher than the outdoor level were recorded indoors); and (3) the collection of two air samples from locations within the residence (Sample 022409-L1 from the dining room and Sample 022409-L2 from the master bedroom), and one sample of ambient air from outdoors (Sample 022409-L3) for subsequent laboratory analysis.

With the direct-reading instrument, readings of 1 part per billion by volume (ppbv) were obtained in the kitchen and master bathroom. A reading of 2 ppbv was obtained in the master bathroom. In the three other rooms tested (front/dining room, living room, and 2<sup>nd</sup> floor bedroom-right), the readings were below the instrument sensitivity level (< 1 ppbv), as was the outdoor air reading.

The collected air samples were individually labeled, documented by a chain of custody form, and shipped via overnight courier to an independent accredited laboratory (Air Toxics, Ltd.) for analysis using American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) Method D-5504 to test for the presence and concentration of eighteen sulfur compounds.

As you can see from the attached results, the laboratory has reported that "No Detections Were Found" for the 18 sulfur compounds in the samples collected in your residential property.

From the direct-reading instrument, the readings of < 1-2 ppbv for hydrogen sulfide in your home match common indoor and outdoor background levels. The outdoor level around your home on February 24, 2009 was below the instrument sensitivity level (< 1 ppbv). We routinely measure 1-2 ppbv of hydrogen sulfide outdoors. The reading of 2 ppbv in one room, particularly in light of the levels of 1 ppbv and below in five other rooms, does not reflect potential exposures in excess of common outdoor levels.

The measurement of 2 ppbv is also well below the level set by the U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry for long-term residential exposures (20 ppbv). Accordingly, ENVIRON has determined that there is no indication that the conditions identified in your residential property would result in adverse human health outcomes.

I apologize for the significant delay in responding to your email. I thought I had replied to your email since it is similar to others I had received. A recent check of emails proved otherwise. To answer your questions:

- 1.- Is this remodeling and rip out of the drywalls is legal?
- A. Only normal building code and permitting requirements apply at this time.
- 2.-Where are those toxic material are going to be throwed?
- A. Currently there are no identified hazards specific to this drywall that would limit its disposal. All drywall is known to release hydrogen sulfide gas as it decomposes in a landfill. The Department of Environmental Protection currently recommends that dedicated loads of drywall be disposed in a class 1 landfill with a gas collection system to control the release of hydrogen sulfide. Direct additional questions of disposal to DEP Solid Waste section (http://www.dep.state.fl.us/waste/).
- 3.-The men working inside the house are not using any safety precautions including personal protective equipment... It is safe for those men?

  A. Currently there are no identified hazards specific to this drywall that would require any special personal protection gear. Workers should be using appropriate protection practices for any normal demolition/remodeling project. We have requested a National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health to perform a Health Hazard Evaluation (http://www.cdc.gov/niosh/hhe/) specifically to answer this concern.

4. An strong smells is getting out of that house, it is normal and safe? There is currently no data to answer that question. All air testing we have received related to day time indoor levels of the drywall do not represent any acute health risk. You are generally able to small reduced sulfur cases at concentrations a hundred times lower than those where the concern for acute health risks begin. Of course this does not mean that the these activities could not create transient levels of the gases which exceed the most conservative safety levels. That is one of the questions to be addressed in the Health Hazard Evaluation.

# Girl Killed in Tragic Accident



April 17, 2006 - It was only a few weeks ago that the young victim's great grandmother passed away. This time though, the Christman family faces an unimaginable loss.

23-year-old Samantha Green was walking along Delaware Avenue in Palmerton with her 2-and-4-year-old daughters, Koryn and Sydney Christman. The children were riding along the sidewalk on abattery-powered toy truck when an out of control car sped right at them.

The vehicle slammed into Samantha and the toy truck with the girls inside, continuing to clip cars and poles until coming to a stop against a tree.

Samantha was seriously injured. Sydney the four-year-old walked away with bumps and bruises. But the two-year-old Koryn was killed instantly.

Lorraine Christman, Koryn's grandmother, says the worst part is, that she knows the person who was behind the wheel.

He's identified as 89-year-old Kenneth Flexer; a man described by many as sweet and generous, and known by nearly everyone in town. Lorraine says she's not angry at Kenny, but that doesn't mean she's not crushed.

The mother, Samantha Green, and the driver, Kenneth Flexer, remain at Lehigh Valley Hospital. Green is being treated for several broken bones, including a broken hip. Flexer remains in the intensive care unit with a broken neck.

The investigation continues, but at this time Flexer has not been charged with a crime.



This investigation was initiated by an internet consumer complaint reported by a homeowner in Parkland, FL. The information contained in this report was obtained during a May 29, 2009 telephone interview with the homeowners at their home in Parkland, Florida.

#### **SUMMARY**

On March 30, 2009, a 51 year-old female homeowner reported that she and her sixty-three year-old spouse and eighteen year-old son have developed a number of health issues and symptoms directly attributable to Chinese Drywall installed in their home. They believe that since moving into their custom built home in July 2007 that their exposure to odors and fumes emitted from the Chinese Drywall has caused all family members to have suffered adverse health effects. The most severe health effects have been headaches, respiratory and sinus infections in addition to other related illnesses while living in the home.

In April 2009, the home owners reported ceasing their home mortgage payments and filed suit against the homebuilder. As of the time of this report, the homeowners are currently living in the home and are attempting to locate a replacement home. The homeowners reported that their son is confined to a wheelchair and they have experienced difficulty in locating a handicapped accessible home.

#### Health Effects

The following adverse health effects have been reported by each of the three family members residing in the home:

Sherri Rojhani, a 51 year-old female, reported as of February 2009, a persistent cough and difficulty breathing while in the home. She has visited her physician and was prescribed medication and an "inhaler" for her symptoms. Mrs. Rojani stated that she suffered from asthma nearly twenty years ago however has not experienced asthma symptoms or had difficulty breathing prior to moving into her home.

infections. In the state of the physician several times this year. He stated that it was difficult for him to estimate exactly when his symptoms condition began however his headaches worsened in winter 2008. He stated that as of a few days ago of this report, he experienced a bloody nose, shortness of breath and eye irritation.

#### **SUMMARY CONTINUED:**

travels frequently and he stated that his headaches and sinus condition are less severe when he is away from his home for long periods of time. He estimated that within an hour of arriving home, his headaches become more pronounced and he experiences respiratory and sinus problems. He believes his health problems are directly related to the odors and smells throughout his home.

is the 18 year-old son who lives at home and is in a wheelchair has reportedly been experiencing eye irritation such as red, burning and crusted eyes. Mrs. Rojhani stated that he has visited an ophthalmologist and received medication in the form of eye drops to treat his current eye condition.

Mrs. Rojhani also reported her son was diagnosed with a skin lesion in December 2008. In January 2009, a pathology report recommended the skin lesion be removed which was surgically removed in April 2009.

Prior to moving into the home in July 2007, the homeowners reported that all family members were in good health and had none of the adverse health effects described in this report prior to their living in the home. The homeowners stated that it was difficult to estimate when they had each started to experience their current health problems. No other persons or pets live in the home.

The homeowners stated they would voluntarily provide copies of their family medical records in support of their complaint to the Commission. During the telephone interview with the homeowners, they stated they would email or fax photographs, medical records and copies of maintenance records and invoices. The homeowners stated they intended to forward the information in the next several days of this report.

#### House Construction

The homeowners reported construction began on their home in 2006 and was completed in July 2007. The family of three moved into the home that month and has lived there to date on a full-time basis. The homeowners reported the builder as WCI Builders, headquartered in Bonita Springs, Florida.

The home was described as a customized handicapped accessible ranch style home, approximately 2600 square feet with an attached garage. Metal studs were used primarily in the construction of the home with small amounts of wood studs use. The homeowners stated that they painted the master bathroom and installed marble flooring since moving into the house.

#### **SUMMARY CONTINUED:**

In September through October of 2008, the homeowners reported noticing sulfur odors similar to "rotten egg" smells in the bathroom sink water. They reported people visiting their home commented on noticing those same odors and smells in various parts of their home. The homeowners stated that when they are away from their home for a number of hours, they arrive home and notice the odors upon arrival. The odors are the strongest in the bathroom, their son's bedroom and a corner section of their living room.

In April, 2008, a water leak in the ceiling damaged drywall in their son's bedroom and drywall original to the home had to be replaced. After replacing the drywall and repairing the leak damage to their son's bedroom, the homeowners reported that the sulfur odors became greater. They specifically noted a corner area of the bedroom had a greater odor than other parts of the room.

#### Corrosion

In October 2008, the homeowners reported experiencing problems with the operation of their original central air conditioning unit that sits inside their finished garage. They reported blackened metal wiring, coils and a large amount of corrosion to their air conditioning system. After several service calls over a two month period, the air conditioner coils were twice replaced, a coolant leak was identified and the thermostat and circuit board were replaced in December 2009. The homeowners reported a more recent service call to address similar operational problems with the unit in February 2009.

They reported that due to the problems with their central air conditioning system, they were unable to obtain an extended warranty after repairs were performed. The homeowners placed several calls to the warranty office for their unit several times and were unable to get an explanation for the unusual high amount of replacement work performed on their air conditioning unit. They were recently informed by the servicing air conditioner contractor that their warranty expired on May 24, 2009. The homeowners stated that they do have before and after repair photographs of the air conditioning unit and would provide them to the Commission.

The homeowners stated that they have also experienced flickering lights on a regular basis and the air conditioner circuit breaker had tripped during operation. Upon further examination, electrical outlet covers were removed to uncover pitted and blackened copper ground wires in every outlet of the home. No other electrical problems or problems with appliances were reported in the home.

#### **SUMMARY CONTINUED:**

The homeowners did report numerous signs of corrosion to fixtures in the home such as pitted and tarnished bathroom faucets, shower heads, silver candlesticks, copper kettle, silver and gold jewelry, silver picture frames and other metal objects in the house. Mrs. Rojhani reported changing discolored metal light fixtures and replacing them with more modern fixtures made of Lucite or non-metal material.

#### Note:

During the interview, the homeowners indicated that they have contacted and met the news media and are pursuing the drywall matter further through their attorney.



#### Family Members:

Husband – 45 year old male Wife – 39 year old female Son – 12 year old male

This incident involves health issues and copper and metal corrosion at the non-seasonal home of the victims over an extended period of time as will be detailed later in this report which the owners believe were caused by contaminated Chinese drywall used in the construction of their home.

The home was 3 bedrooms, 2 bathrooms new construction, 1100 square foot ranch style, wood frame with stucco built in 2005 and occupied by the owners on 6-22-2005 in Satsuma, FL. The owner contacted the CPSC on 3-28-2009 which is the incident date. The home had carpet flooring except in the kitchen and bathrooms.



The home was built by a small local firm who purchased a few parcels of land and built a few homes in 2005. The complainant could not provide any documents on the firm and believed they dissolved the company after the homes had been built. No information on the firm could be located on the Internet. The

complainant could offer no information on the source of the drywall or the subcontractor who installed the drywall.

The female complainant indicated she and her son began having medical symptoms from the tainted drywall immediately after the family moved into the home. The husband began experiencing health effects after about two months.

The male complainant stated he had itchy burning eyes, allergy type respiratory symptoms and sinus irritation. The female complainant was experiencing bloody nose, stuffy nose, burning eyes and constant respiratory type infections. Their son was having ear and sinus infections approximately every three months and was given antibiotics by their physician. The family's German Sheppard was experiencing watery eyes and often refused to come into the home. None of the symptoms existed prior to moving into the home.

The family noticed a "weird sulphur smell mixed with something else, almost a horrible rotten egg smell that almost knocks you over and is even noticeable on the front porch." The odor is more noticeable before or after it rains and was stronger in the bedroom closest to the front of the home. The family was keeping that door closed and had painted the room with *Bear-Home Depot* paint which seemed to slow down and prevent some of the odor. The wife stated she could not sleep in their bedroom without a window being left open all the time. Originally the family did not know the source of the odors so they had been steam cleaning the carpet every three months with no noticeable change in the degree of odor.

The family did not know the source of their medical symptoms and believed it was from the house and the new location of their home. However in February of 2009 they saw a report on the Chinese Drywall on *CNN* and immediately realized that their home must have been constructed from the tainted drywall and was producing the medical symptoms/smell they had not been experiencing prior to moving into the home.

The family had to replace the inside air conditioner coils in August of 2006. Even though the part was still under warranty it cost the family \$900 for the labor repairs. The family indicated they would send a copy of the repair ticket but it had not been received by the time this report was due. Should the report be received it will be submitted as an addendum. The coils were not examined by this investigator due to the difficulty in accessing the unit. The A/C technician stated that the corrosion was caused by sulphur in their water system. However the complainant stated that they do not have a problem with sulphur in the water and in fact is excellent water.


The family indicated that a GFI outlet in the kitchen had been flipping frequently. The outlet cover was removed however the outlet could not be identified or

examined because the façade counter splash plate was too tight to allow access to the outlet mounting screws.

An electric outlet in the living room was removed from the wall and photographed. It showed only mild corrosion. Most of the water supply lines were plastic. Some of the chrome bathroom fixtures showed pitting and corrosion. The family's new laptop computer died in January 2009 and was still broken.

The complainant indicated that the home had a weird gray dust that was always settling on ceiling fan blades and their affects. She stated that within two days of cleaning the ceiling fan blades there would be new grey dust collecting. An excellent example of the grey dust was in a speaker access whole in their son's bedroom television.



The sheetrock in the home was not cut out or examined by the family. However the attic access panel was removed and labeling showed the product to be American products drywall. Please see the photographs in the exhibits

The family had not had any other problems with electrical devices malfunctioning in their home however she stated that the electrical panel would sometimes make a buzzing sound which was not detectable at the time of this inspection by either this investigator or the homeowner. One of the smoke detectors in a bedroom was hard wired to the home's electrical system but it would make a beeping noise and was disconnected. The complainant said he would look for the smoke detector and ship it to this investigator. It had not been received by the time this report was due and will be added as an addendum if received.

The male complainant stated that he worked for a local drywall manufacturer from October 2007 to February 2009. He stated that the firm's web site stated that the firm "has never imported, repackaged or sold Chinese-produced drywall in the North American market." Please see the exhibits. However he stated that the warehouse where he worked had approximately 100 crates of 200 sheets each of drywall. He stated the employees would call it "China Board." He did not know what happened to the supply but eventually it was no longer in their warehouse by December of 2008. He indicated that the plant produced sheetrock in an unknown manner from mined raw material and waste from the local coal plant. The firm would also recycle old drywall in producing new product.

The family had not contacted any other agencies or investigator regarding their home's problems but indicated that another person in the seven homes built by the builder was also experiencing health symptoms. She did not know what they were going to do in the future as they couldn't sell the home and couldn't afford to move to another home and still make payments on this home.

The home owner indicated her permission to release her name only to the manufacturer. She also indicated that discretion should be used in releasing the data from the ex-employer of her husband. The web site for the drywall manufacturer did not list a corporation address but one was found on the Internet and the information is included in the exhibits.











Close up of labeling.




Photograph of the home's A/C system.








Labeling on the back of the sheetrock in the attic.

This letter is on behalf of the Goodman Company, L.P. ("Goodman" or "the Company") in response to your July 31, 2009 letter to Raymond V. Carroll, Jr. at Goodman regarding Epidemiologic Incident Report ("EIR") 090505CBB1683. Goodman requests that the undersigned counsel be notified in the event that the CPSC receives an inquiry under the Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") for disclosure of EIR 090505CBB1683 and/or for these responsive comments.

EIR 090505CBB1683 concerns alleged drywall issues at a Florida residence. The EIR states that a coil for a Goodman air conditioner at the residence was replaced in August 2006, and it implies that the coil corrosion resulted from the drywall issues. The EIR does not allege or indicate any safety-related potential concerns or problems with the Goodman product.

Please observe that this letter contains business proprietary information. Goodman designates this letter confidential under applicable CPSC regulations, and does not consent to the release of any information.

This letter is in response to your July 22, 2009 correspondence to United States Gypsum Company regarding the above referenced FOIA requests. We have reviewed all the documents enclosed with your letter, which include the FOIA requests and the CPSC files that the commission is considering producing in response.

United States Gypsum Company has the following comments for your consideration:

First, we want to make clear that United States Gypsum Company has never
manufactured wallboard in China. Our SHEETROCK® brand gypsum drywall
has always been manufactured in North America only. Therefore, we believe that
to the extent any CPSC documents mention wallboard made by U.S. Gypsum
Company, those documents are not responsive to FOIA requests that are
specifically directed at CPSC investigations into Chinese drywall.

Second, in more than 90 years of making wallboard, U.S. Gypsum Company has not had complaints about is SHEETROCK® brand drywall similar to those being made regarding Chinese wallboard.

Third, production of some of these documents by the CPSC in response to Chinese wallboard inquiries would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that our company's primary product, SHEETROCK® brand gypsum drywall, may have been manufactured in China or that the CPSC believes our product may cause problems similar to those that some Chinese wallboard apparently has

caused. Neither is true, and nothing in the documents sent to us suggests otherwise.

2. The following are brief comments on each of the six files that you sent to us for review:

No. 090504CBB1656

No comment or objection.

#### No. 09054CBB1662

This investigation file relates to a homeowner who believes that his family has developed numerous health conditions related to Chinese drywall in his home. However, neither the homeowner nor the CPSC investigator was able to locate a label on the drywall to confirm the drywall manufacturer. A letter in the file from drywall supplier Seacoast Supply indicates that it did supply some drywall to the home but that based on the delivery date the drywall delivered was manufactured by U.S. Gypsum Company in the United States and is not Chinese-made drywall.

Because no Chinese drywall has been identified in the home, this investigation file is not responsive to FOIA requests for "Chinese Drywall Files". Further, production of the file at this time – prior to a full inspection of <u>all</u> the wallboard in the home and a full investigation into the health issues described by the homeowners – would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that that the family's health issues are related to U.S. Gypsum wallboard. There is no evidence that this is true and the CPSC file does not reveal any reason to believe that such a suggestion is true.

Therefore, U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

#### No. 090505CBB1683

As with the previous file, this file reports a homeowner complaint that various health symptoms and copper blackening in his house are related to Chinese drywall. Again, there has been no inspection of all of the drywall in the home to confirm the presence of any Chinese material. The only drywall that has been identified in the report is U.S. Gypsum SHEETROCK® brand drywall, which was reportedly visible only in the attic and is not made in China. There is nothing in the file to confirm the presence of any Chinese drywall in the home. We are aware of other homes where Chinese-made ½"drywall was installed in the walls

of home, and U.S. Gypsum or other 5/8" inch drywall was installed in the ceiling or attic (5/8 inch wallboard typically is used on ceilings, while walls are typically ½ inch board).

Production of this complaint file before a full inspection of <u>all</u> the wallboard in the home and before a full investigation into the health issues described by the homeowners, would inaccurately and unfairly suggest to the public that the family's health issues are related to U.S. Gypsum wallboard.

If any of this homeowner's alleged problems are caused by wallboard in the home, it is more likely that the problems are caused by undiscovered Chinese wallboard than by U.S. Gypsum Company wallboard, which has never been associated with the complaints being made regarding Chinese drywall.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

#### No. 090505C1688

This investigation was initiated by a tenant who complained of health issues and copper blackening in her rented home. The manufacturer of the drywall in the home is not confirmed; however, the tenant believes her problems are related to Chinese drywall. As with prior claims addressed herein, the only drywall that was accessible and inspected was located in the attic of the home.

There has been no confirmation that any wallboard in the home was manufactured in China and no investigation into what may be causing the tenant's complaints. Because there is only one unverified reference to U.S. Gypsum Company wallboard in the file, production of these documents by the CPSC in response to FOIA requests would unfairly and inaccurately suggest that U.S. Gypsum wallboard may be a part of the tenant's problems — and there is nothing either in the file or outside the file to support that suggestion.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.

#### No. 090520CBB2638

This file relates to an investigation into a homeowner complaint of health symptoms and electrical component failures that the homeowner believes might be related to Chinese drywall. The CPSC investigator found no evidence of Chinese drywall – although he did obtain information (a purchase receipt

produced by the homeowner) that suggests that some of the drywall in the house was manufactured by two U.S. companies – United States Gypsum and Georgia Pacific. However, there was no visual confirmation that the wallboard in the home was in fact manufactured by the two companies. The investigator did <u>not</u> notice any unusual smell in the home and found <u>no</u> visible blackening of copper wire or other metal surfaces – the symptoms frequently reported in homes with the Chinese drywall problems.

There is no evidence of Chinese drywall in the home, the CPSC investigator did not observe any unusual smell or copper blackening, and there is no evidence that the wallboard in the home is causing any problems whatsoever. Therefore, this report is not responsive to the FOIA request. Production of these material in response to the pending FOIA requests may inaccurately suggest that the homeowner's reported problems are related to the presence of wallboard manufactured by two U.S. manufacturers, and there is nothing to support that conclusion.

U.S. Gypsum requests that this file not be produced or in the alternative that any mention of our company be deleted.
