## REPLY OF BRIAN THIEL AND KRISTINE MAKO TO PETITIONER'S AND RESPONDENT'S RESPONSE TO PETITION TO INTERVENE

Brian Thiel and Kristine Mako agree with Petitioner and Respondent that they more properly meet the criteria for intervention as non-parties under 16 CFR §1025.17(b). Accordingly, they withdraw their request to intervene as a party.

With respect to intervention as a non-party, Complaint Counsel (Petitioner) takes no position. Respondent appears to not object, stating (at page 6 of its Response):

Instead, this Court should permit Petitioners to participate, if at all, as non-party participants, as alternatively requested in their Petition.

Mr. Thiel and Ms. Make do not have any desire to litigate their individual case within this administrative proceeding. They have ample opportunity for discovery in their own personal case. Rather, they desire to provide maximum assistance to the CPSC in order to help assure that the dangerous products at issue permanently remain off the market. Although their claims (pending in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan) are unique to the incident involving the death of their child, the fact gathering they have undertaken has broader application which would be of significant benefit in these proceedings.
